



▪ simply grand ▪ graceful shawl



Materials

Yarn: 3-4 skeins Louisa Harding Grace (or similar weight yarn), depending on the size desired.

Yardage: 330-440 yards

Needles: Size 10 32" circular, or size to obtain gauge.

Gauge

Approximately 4 stitches per inch in stockinette stitch.

Abbreviations

k	knit
p	purl
st	stitch
st st	stockinette stitch: knit right side rows and purl wrong side rows.
yo	bring yarn forward between needles and up over right needle, creating a fake stitch
s2kp	slip 2 stitches together as if to knit, knit 1, and pass both slipped stitches over the knit stitch. This decreases your stitch count by 2.
RS	right side
WS	wrong side

SHAWL STITCH PATTERNS

Set-Up Rows

Row 1: k1, YO, k3, YO, k1 (RS) (7sts)

Row 2: Knit across (WS)

Row 3: k3, YO, k1, YO, k3 (9sts)

Row 4: k3, p3, k3

Lace Pattern

Row 1: k3, YO, knit until 3 sts remain, YO, k3 (RS)

Row 2: k3, purl to last 3 sts, k3 (WS)

Row 3: k3, YO, k1, YO, *S2kp, YO, k1, YO*. Repeat from * until 3 sts remain (The first row you will only be knitting one of the asterisked sequences.)

Row 4: k3, purl to last 3 sts, k3

6-Row Stockinette Panel

Row 1: k3 YO, knit to last 3 sts, YO, k3

Row 2: k3, purl to last 3 sts, k3

Repeat Rows 1 and 2 twice more

SHAWL INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 5 sts. Knit one row (WS).

Work Set-Up Rows one time.

Section 1: Work Lace Pattern three times.

Section 2: Work Stockinette Panel one time.

Section 3: Work Lace Pattern five times.

Section 4: Work Stockinette Panel one time.

You will be working alternating lace sections and stockinette sections. The lace sections alternate between three repeats and five repeats of the Lace Pattern, while the stockinette sections remain the same. When you look at the shawl, it will look like 3 rows of holes, 6 rows of stockinette, 5 rows of holes, 6 rows of stockinette, and so on.

Work all four shawl sections three times total. Then work sections 1 & 2 once more. Work Lace Pattern one time (creating one row of holes).* Bind off loosely.

Finishing

Weave in ends. Spray lightly with water and block out evenly.

**Pattern Note:* These instructions are for the same version as shown in the photo. For a bigger shawl, you can continue working the lace and stockinette sections until desired size. But please note that you will need more yarn. Please also note that the pattern sample used almost exactly 3 skeins of Louisa Harding Grace. Because personal gauges vary, just be sure to leave enough yarn to bind off with. If you are running short on yarn and are concerned you won't be able to complete the final repeat of the Lace Pattern, you can use your personal preference as to where to finish the shawl and bind off. Or, of course, you can always add more yarn and have the option of making it larger.
