



## ▪ simply grand ▪ ruffled wrist cozies

*You can knit this fun accessory in just a couple of short sittings. With seed stitch trim, a ruffled cuff, and a diamond panel stitch pattern, these wrist cozies are decidedly feminine and make a lovely gift (if you can part with them). Worked in a flat piece from cuff to the finger opening, the cozies are simply seamed up the side, leaving an opening for the thumb.*

### Materials

**Yarn:** Approximately 150 yards of a DK weight yarn in the main color and just a few yards of a contrasting color in the same weight. Our shop model uses 2 skeins Louisa Harding Grace in purple and 1 skein Louisa Harding Grace in black for the trim.

**Needles:** Size 6, or size to obtain gauge.

### Gauge

5 ½ stitches per inch in stockinette stitch.

### Abbreviations

k	knit
p	purl
st	stitch
k2tog	knit 2 stitches together
RS	right side
WS	wrong side

### Instructions

Beginning at the cuff edge, cast on 82 stitches in contrasting color. Change to main color.

Row 1: \*K1, p1. Repeat from \* across.

Row 2: \*P1, k1. Repeat from \* across.

Repeat Rows 1 & 2 four more times (10 rows of seed stitch worked.)

Row 11 (RS): K2tog across row (41 sts).

Row 12 (WS): K1, \*P7, K1. Repeat from \* to end.

Row 13: K4, \*P1, K7. Repeat from \* to last 5 sts, P1, K4.

Row 14: K1, \*P2, K1, P1, K1, P2, K1. Repeat from \* to end.

Row 15: K2, \*(P1, K1) twice, P1, K3. Repeat from \* to last 7 sts, (P1, K1) twice, P1, K2.

Row 16: Repeat Row 14.

Row 17: Repeat Row 13.

Row 18: Repeat Row 12.

Row 19: Knit.

Repeat Rows 12-19 four times more. You should have panels containing five seed stitch diamonds.

Work Row 12 once more.

Next Row: \*K1, p1. Repeat from \* across.

Next Row: \*P1, k1. Repeat from \* across.

Repeat these rows two more times (6 rows total of seed stitch).

Change to contrasting color. Bind off loosely knitwise.

Repeat all instructions for second wrist cozy.

### Finishing

Lightly block pieces before seaming. Fold wrist cozy in half, bringing straight sides together. Beginning at the top edge (or the fingers end), use mattress stitch to seam just beyond the flat seed stitch border. Then leave about 1 ½ inches open for the thumb hole. With a new piece of yarn, resume seaming just below the thumb hole and work toward the ruffled wrist section. You may also start second part of seaming at the ruffled wrist edge and work toward the thumb, being sure to leave the 1 ½ inches open. Weave in ends. Repeat for second wrist cozy.

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
