winter knitalong

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“just one row” reversible stitch patterns

Sometimes we all want a pattern that’s easy on the mind but has impressive results. It’s great to find stitch patterns that require just one pattern row and create a reversible fabric that works perfectly for scarves. These are three examples of just such stitch patterns. In each case, you just have to pick a yarn with appropriately sized needles, cast on a number (based on the required multiple) to create your desired width, and knit that one row over and over again until the scarf is as long as you like.

- **Stitch pattern #1**
(multiple of 4)
K4, *yo, k2tog, k2. Repeat from * until end of row.
- **Stitch pattern #2**
(multiple of 3 plus 4)
K2, *yo, slip one as if to k, pssso (pass slipped st over the two previously knit sts). Repeat from * until 2 sts left, k2.
- **Stitch Pattern #3**
(multiple of 4 plus 2)
*K2, k into the back of the next stitch, p1. Repeat from * until there are 2 stitches left. K2.

To discover other stitch patterns that you can use for scarves, check out *365 Knitting Stitches a Year Calendar*, *Vogue Knitting Stitchionary Volume 1*, or *Knit & Purl* and *Lace & Eyelets* from *The Harmony Guides*.

classes at a grand yarn

Registration: Class registration begins immediately on a first-come, first-served basis. Pre-payment is required with registration to secure your spot in the class. You can register in person or over the phone. Supplies are not included in the class fee.

Cancellations: You may cancel up to one week before the first class for a full refund. If you cancel later than that, we will issue a refund if we are able to fill your space. You can transfer class fees to apply to another class within the same semester if you still let us know a week prior to the original class. If a class does not fill with the minimum students, we will cancel the class and issue a full refund.

Student Discounts: Students receive a non-transferable, one-time 10% storewide discount card at the time of registration. The discount is valid through the last day of class. The AGY Club discount can be applied on top of the class discount. You will need to present your discount card at the time of purchase.

Skill Level: Our class descriptions include a skill level to help you choose classes that suit your abilities.

Learn To. You have never picked up needles or you need a refresher of the basics. *Beginner.* You know how to cast on, knit, purl, and bind off. *Advanced Beginner.* You are comfortable with knitting, purling, and binding off. Some experience with shaping. *Intermediate.* You have completed many projects, can read most patterns, and are ready for more challenging projects.

Private Lessons: If you can’t make one of the class times, there is a specific skill or project you want to learn, or you work better one-on-one, consider making an appointment for a private lesson. Our teachers are available for lessons on any skill or project you have in mind. Lessons are \$25 per hour for one person or \$35 per hour for two people.

Special Group Classes: Ask us about possibilities of arranging your own group for a specific class.

BEGINNING KNITTING: SCARF AND HAT *Fee: \$65*
with Gerda Porter

If you want to become a knitter, this is an excellent place to start. This comprehensive class will help you learn to cast on, knit, purl, increase, decrease, cast off, and read patterns. Over the course of the class, you will work on a scarf and a hat. You can even make yourself a matching set! (Skill Level: Learn To. 4 sessions. Maximum 6 students.)

Students may start the Stitch Club at any session. (Skill Level: Beginner and Up. 1 session.)

Mary's daughter, Ingrid, is going to travel to Spokane to squeeze in a few more classes before the arrival of her new baby. We hope you can join her for fun classes featuring small and manageable projects.

STELLA PIXIE HAT NEW! *Fee: \$25*

This clever design is adapted from a 1944 pattern and features ribbing going vertically and horizontally to create a cute little pointed hat. Join Ingrid as you learn to knit this classic pattern that is sure to make people gush over the little one wearing it. Please note some homework required prior to class. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

Friday: 1/29 – 3:00-5:00

FOUR CORNERS HAT *Fee: \$35*

Back by popular demand, this class focuses on the striking Four Corners Hat pattern from Cabin Fever. The crown is made up of four modular pieces that are picked up from one another. Then the brim is picked up and knit down and can feature a Fair Isle or slip stitch design. In this workshop, Ingrid will equip you with the tools necessary to proceed with your own Four Corners Hat. Sizes range from child to large adult. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

Saturday: 1/30 – 1:00-5:00

PRAIRIE BOOTS NEW! *Fee: \$35*

These adorable slippers from Cocoknits can be worn two ways: pulled up like boots or turned down with a cuff. Knit at a chunky gauge in a combination of k1, p1 rib and garter stitch, they come together quite quickly. In this workshop, Ingrid will get you going on the boots so you can finish them confidently in no time. Please note some homework required prior to class. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

Saturday: 3/20 – 10:00-1:00

NORWEGIAN BABY HAT *Fee: \$15*

In this quickie class, you will learn how to knit an absolutely precious striped baby cap with a Scandinavian flavor (it looks a lot like the cute Hanna Andersson pilot caps). With just some basic shaping every other row, you can create a face-framing shape that will look darling on any little one. In this class, you will learn the tips and tricks of the pattern, including a way to keep from having to look at the pattern. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

OOPS! with Gerda Porter

Don't let a mistake derail your project! In this immensely helpful class, Gerda will teach you how to correct your mistakes so that one little goof doesn't mean you have to rip out the whole thing. These are invaluable skills to have that will save you a lot of time and frustration in your knitting. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

SEAM LIKE A PROFESSIONAL with Mary Perry **NEW!**

Wednesday: 2/3 – 10:30-12:30

Fee: \$25

It's so disappointing when seams in a garment detract from all your beautiful knitting. In this class, you will learn how to create professional-looking seams so that your finished sweaters look amazing. Join Mary as you learn these invaluable techniques. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

PICKING FOR THROWERS with Gerda Porter

Wednesday: 2/10 – 3:00-5:00

Fee: \$25

Are you a picker or a thrower? Pickers, or Continental knitters, carry the yarn in their left hand, while throwers wrap with their right. Many feel that picking is faster and easier on your hands than throwing. If you are already a thrower but would like to try changing to a picker, this class is a great place to begin. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

CABLING WITHOUT A CABLE NEEDLE with Karen Wohlen

Friday: 1/22 – 10:30-12:30

Fee: \$25

In this class, Karen will teach you how to say goodbye to cable needles and hello to much faster cabling. Without all that stopping and going, your knitting becomes much more efficient. This is a great class you don't want to miss. Please note that previous cable knitting experience is required. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

AVOIDING THE KITCHENER STITCH NEW!

with Karen Wohlen

Friday: 2/19 – 10:30-12:30

Fee: \$25

Few knitting skills cast fear into the hearts of knitters as Kitchener stitch does. In this class, Karen will teach you how to use an alternative to Kitchener so you don't have to worry about it any more. This is a great class for sock knitters. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

PERFECT PATTERN READING with Karen Wohlen **NEW!**

Friday: 3/5 – 10:30-12:30

Fee: \$25

Sometimes pattern reading seems straightforward. But sometimes you run into phrases like "reverse the shaping" or "at the same time" and it can all get confusing very quickly. Join Karen as you learn to interpret the language of patterns like an expert. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

JOGLESS STRIPES IN THE ROUND with Mary Perry

Wednesday: 1/27 – 1:00-3:00

Fee: \$25

One of the only dampers on the joy of knitting in the round is the fact that when you are striping you get that annoying little color jog at the beginning of the round. Well, Mary can teach you how to eliminate that jog and add that extra level of neatness to your knitting. This is one of those skills that you will use time and time again. Please note that experience knitting in the round is required. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

WELCOME TO INTARSIA with Pat Nerbun **NEW!**

Friday: 1/15 – 1:00-3:00

Fee: \$25

"Intarsia" may sound like a mysterious, faraway land in a storybook. But really it's a useful knitting skill in which you carry different colors of yarn in a certain section of knitting (as opposed to carrying the color across an entire row as with Fair Isle). Intarsia is often thought of as the skill for "picture knitting," like if you want to knit a picture of a puppy on the front of a child's sweater. In this class, Pat will introduce you to intarsia and fill you with helpful hints for intarsia success. In other words, "Intarsia" won't seem so mysterious and faraway after all. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

KNITTING INFIRMARY with Karen Wohlen **NEW!**

Friday: 2/5 – 10:30-12:30

Fee: \$25

Not only is Karen Wohlen a medical doctor, she's also a qualified knitting doctor! In this immensely helpful new class, you can bring any mistake, question, or problem to Karen and she will help you (and all the other students) learn how to fix it. This is a great way to share knitting questions and build your skills together. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

lace knitting

BEGINNING LACE: MAKE IT AND TAKE IT NEW!

with LeAnn Whiting

Saturday: 2/20 – 10:00-1:00 Fee: \$30

If you are ready to venture into lace but are a little nervous about it, this is the place to start. In this class, you will knit an adorable little soap sack. The project is so small and manageable, you will actually be able to finish it in the course of the workshop. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

WILDFLOWER LACE with LeAnn Whiting NEW!

Thursday: 2/18 – 10:30-1:30 Fee: \$30

This beautiful scarf with a shallow triangular shape is mostly garter stitch but with a delicate lace edging. The piece is knit from side to side and is an excellent way to knit just a little bit of lace into a scarf. Join LeAnn as you take on this Evelyn Clark design for an accessory that is sure to become a favorite. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

FAROESE SHAWL with LeAnn Whiting NEW!

Wednesdays: 1/13, 2/3, 3/3 – 5:30-7:30 Fee: \$50

What makes a Faroese shawl really distinctive is the shaping, which is designed to hug your shoulders and make the garment easily wearable. In this very special class, LeAnn will walk you through knitting a magnificent lace Faroese shawl designed by Lucy Neatby. If you have been wanting to take on a more ambitious lace project, this is the class for you. (Skill Level: Intermediate. 3 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

WHIP COWL with Leslie Huppín NEW!

Tuesday: 1/12 – 2:00-4:00 Fee: \$25

This beautiful accessory from Classic Elite is a perfect way to do some lace knitting but without too much complication. Knit in the round and featuring triangular lace designs, this cowl can be worn around the neck or pulled up over the back of the head for extra warmth. Join Leslie as you learn to make this wonderful neckwarmer. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

IVY VINES COWL with Leslie Huppín NEW!

Tuesdays: 1/26 & 2/9 – 2:00-3:00 Fee: \$30

Cowls are great for several reasons: they often don't take as long to knit as scarves, you don't have to worry about them falling off, and they are fun to knit. In this class, Leslie will teach you how to knit a lovely lace version with a vine-like motif. This is an excellent way to take on lace without too much of a commitment. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 2 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

socks

KNIT YOUR FIRST SOCKS with Gerda Porter

Saturdays: 2/27, 3/13, 3/27 – 1:00-3:00 Fee: \$50

Socks are great projects to work on: they're small, portable, and fun. If you have been wanting to learn how to knit socks, this is a great place to start. In this class, Gerda will teach you how to knit socks in the traditional way from the cuff down. Students will have the option of knitting on double-points or on one long circular using the Magic Loop method. You just might get hooked! (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 3 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

BEYOND BASIC SOCKS with Mary Perry Fee: \$40

Wednesdays: 1/27 – 10:30-12:30 AND 2/10 – 10:30-1:30

In this "next steps" sock class, Mary will guide you through knitting a more advanced lace-patterned sock knit from the toe up. If you are ready to venture beyond the basic top-down, ribbed-cuff sock, this is the class for you. Please note that previous sock knitting experience is required. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 2 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

VINTAGE BUTTON BAG with Mary Lindeblad

Thursdays: 1/21 & 1/28 – 1:00-3:00 Fee: \$35

We are excited to be bringing back this class featuring the popular bag from *Pursenalities*. Knit with an eye-catching rounded shape and many options for making it uniquely yours, this felted bag is as fun to knit as it is to use. Join Mary as you learn to make this great accessory, which makes a wonderful gift (that is, after you have knit one for yourself!). (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 2 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

CONSTANT COMPANION with Leslie Huppín

Saturdays: 2/27 & 3/6 – 10:30-12:30 Fee: \$35

This class is a perennial favorite at AGY. The "Companion" felted bags have a fun-to-knit and practical design with a rectangular base and sides picked up from there. A unique i-cord bind-off gives the top of the bag extra durability. In this class, students will have the option of knitting any one of the three sizes. (Skill Level: Beginner and Up. 2 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

small projects

MONTANA EARFLAP HAT with Gerda Porter NEW!

Wednesday: 1/20 – 3:00-5:00 *Fee: \$25*

In this class, Gerda will teach you how to knit a darling hat that's fun to knit and keeps your ears warm to boot. Knit at a heavier gauge with a very simple Fair Isle pattern, this is a great project for learning how to work with two colors. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

POROM HAT with Mary Perry NEW!

Thursdays: 2/4 & 2/11 – 11:30-12:30 *Fee: \$30*

This beret-style hat designed by Jared Flood has a huge following—and with good reason. Knit with a feminine lace pattern and a slouch style, this accessory looks great on anyone, of any age. Join Mary as you learn the tips and tricks for success with the Porom hat, and you'll be sure to find yourself with many requests from family and friends for more. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 2 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

BEAUMONT HAT with Gerda Porter NEW!

Tuesday: 3/30 – 1:00-3:00 *Fee: \$25*

Some Fair Isle patterns just take your breath away, and this is one of them. The Beaumont Hat, designed by Jared Flood, can be knit in a beret style or a beanie style, both having stunning results. In this class, Gerda will guide you through the colorwork charts and help you on your way. And depending on your color choices, the hat can have entirely different looks. (Skill Level: Intermediate. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

JEJUNE HAT with Leslie Huppin NEW!

Tuesday: 2/23 – 2:00-4:00 *Fee: \$25*

The JeJune Hat is a new design from Berroco and features two colors of the wonderful Inca Gold. Worked in a grid-like pattern, it is striking for both its color and texture. Join Leslie as you learn to make this surprisingly simple and fun hat. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

LINEN STITCH HAT with Leslie Huppin NEW!

Tuesday: 3/23 – 2:00-4:00 *Fee: \$25*

What is fascinating about linen stitch is that you use your knitting techniques to create a fabric that looks woven. In this class, Leslie will teach you how to apply the linen stitch to a hat—with incredible results. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

LINEN STITCH SCARF with Leslie Huppin NEW!

Tuesday: 3/9 – 2:00-3:00 *Fee: \$15*

We were so impressed with Leslie's linen stitch scarf, we simply had to make it a class. Knit in Manos Silk Blend (or another yarn of your choice) and worked lengthwise, the pattern calls for the ends of your yarn to double as the fringe. The stitch is fun to do, and the scarf is one absolutely anyone would love. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

FRESCO WRISTWARMERS with Leslie Huppin NEW!

Tuesday: 2/16 – 1:00-3:00 *Fee: \$25*

We are in love with Classic Elite's new yarn, Fresco, and we are equally in love with these cute wristwarmers knit out of it. With an eye-catching textured pattern and simple techniques, these wristwarmers are quick and fun to knit. You might have a hard time knitting just one pair. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 1 session. Maximum 8 students.)

sweaters

EINSTEIN COAT with Mary Lindeblad

Fridays: 1/29, 2/26, 3/26 – 1:00-2:00

Fee: \$40

Sally Melville gave this classic sweater coat its name because you feel like such a genius knitting it. This garment is simple enough for a first sweater project and fun enough for knitters of all skill levels. In fact, the class involves just three one-hour sessions to get you launched on each section. Knit entirely out of garter stitch with large panels picked up off of other pieces, this sweater is flattering on everyone and can be shortened or lengthened as you desire. You are just going to love it. (Skill Level: Beginner and Up. 3 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

WONDERFUL WALLABY with Gerda Porter

Saturdays: 2/6, 2/20, 3/6, 3/27 – 3:00-5:00

Fee: \$65

One of our all-time most popular projects at AGY, the Wonderful Wallaby is a hooded sweatshirt-style sweater perfect for men, women, kids, and adults of all sizes and tastes. The sweater is worked in the round from the bottom up, so there's hardly any finishing. Gerda is our resident Wonderful Wallaby Wonder Woman, and she has all sorts of tips and tricks to make your first Wallaby a roaring success. Students have the option of knitting any size, from a child's 2 through an adult XXL. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 4 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

MI ESCUELITA CARDIGAN with Gerda Porter **NEW!**

Thursdays: 1/14, 1/28, 2/11 – 3:00-5:00

Fee: \$50

Any little girl would simply love to wear this fabulous cardigan from Knitty. With simple cables down the front and back and ribbed sleeves that hug the arms, this sweater is a joy to knit and is sure to be one that is really worn. Join Gerda as you learn to knit this great cardigan, which is a great way to work on your cabling and shaping skills. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 3 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

CENTRAL PARK HOODIE with Pat Nerbun

Fridays: 1/22, 2/12, 3/5, 3/19 – 1:00-3:00

Fee: \$65

The Central Park Hoodie from Interweave is a hugely popular sweater, with over 3,000 knitters listed as making it on Ravelry. This beautiful, casual sweater is the kind you will want to wear constantly and will be so proud to say that you knit. With cables up the sides, sleeves, and hood, the sweater has a lot of visual interest and is a ton of fun to make. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 4 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

MINIMALIST CARDIGAN with Gerda Porter

Thursdays: 2/4, 2/25, 3/11 – 3:00-5:00

Fee: \$50

This simple, classic cardigan with three-quarter sleeves and an open front is one of those sweaters that becomes a wardrobe staple. Appropriate for at least three seasons a year, this moss-stitch sweater is particularly suited for the late winter and early springtime when you need just a little bit of warmth. Join Gerda and learn how to make this immensely popular garment from a 2007 issue of *Interweave Knits*. (Skill Level: Advanced Beginner and Up. 3 sessions. Maximum 8 students.)

suit yourself

In this knitting-circle-style class taught by Gerda Porter or Pat Nerbun, students have the option of knitting anything they want. You can select a project you would to launch but are a little wary of doing on your own. Or you can pick something you are already working on but need help finishing. The idea is to get the class experience—receiving help from a skilled teacher, getting to know other knitters, encouraging your classmates, and ultimately achieving project success—but with projects of your own choosing.
